We are talking this year about how Jesus


teaches life lessons through stories called "Parables" and how these parables apply to our lives. Each month this year we will explore a different parable. And learn about Jesus' teachings.

Preschool Registration is Open For 2024-2025 School Year



This has been an awesome school year for us at Son Shine Preschool. God is good!

As of March 1 we are open for registrations for the next school year—2024-2025. We offer a \$25 discount for those that register prior to May 31. Children must be 3, 4, or 5 by August 31 and toilet trained.

The 3-year old class meets on Mondays and Wednesdays and the tuition is \$140 per month.

The 4– and 5-year old class meets Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays and the tuition is \$175 per month.

If you know of someone who could benefit from our Christian Preschool experience, please let them know. Registration forms are available online, outside the preschool room, or through the church office and must be accompanied by an \$80 (\$55 prior to May 31) registration fee.



On Palm Sunday, March 24, we had the privilege of witnessing four of our young people confirm their faith in Jesus through Confirmation. What does Jesus mean to me?

What does Baptism mean to Me?
