

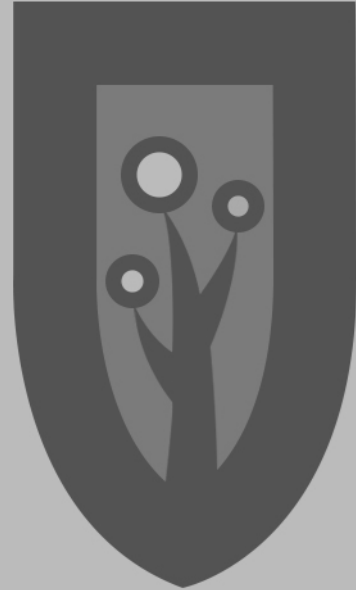

Schedule change this week and next week: Both weeks we will only have one morning service at 10 a.m. There will be no Sunday School or “To Be” groups. On December 31 you may bring any leftover cookies to share and we will have fellowship with cookies in the narthex after the service. We will resume our normal schedule on Sunday, January 7, 2024

Worship each week is normally at 8:30 a.m. & 10:45 a.m.: Each week we offer two services—an early more traditional service at 8:30 a.m. and a later more contemporary service at 10:45 a.m. The blessing of this schedule is that it allows for at least 45 minutes of fellowship over coffee and goodies in our Fellowship Hall with all worshipers from both services together. Please plan to join us for fellowship and worship! Fellowship is at 9:45-10:30 a.m. Weekly Sunday Services will break from this normal schedule on Christmas Eve and New Years Eve with services at 10 a.m. each of these days. The normal schedule will resume January 7.

Holy Cross Resource Conservation Initiatives: Holy Cross recently implemented three initiatives to conserve resources and money: (1) a retrofit to all LED lighting, (2) a smart water irrigation system, and (3) smart thermostats. The thermostats have been set based on planned activities in the church. When the space is not scheduled they are set to 60 degrees in the winter and 90 degrees in the summer. This will save money, energy, and increase the life of our HVAC system. If the space is not at a comfortable temperature for your group, feel free to make an adjustment for the time you are here but please return the thermostat to the standard set point (60 degrees winter, or 90 degrees summer) when you are finished using the space.
